Tom Keifer #keiferband 2024 Bio

Tom Keifer remains a resilient, relevant figure in the rock world through constant reimagination and renewal. His story begins as the singer-songwriter, guitarist and front man of hard rock heavyweights Cinderella. His signature voice and guitar, and bluesy, no-BS arena-shaking songwriting, were integral in moving 15 million records worldwide. Over the past decade, Keifer transitioned his talents to a solo career, enjoying continued success recording and touring with #keiferband. #keiferband is Tom Keifer, Savannah Keifer, Tony Higbee, Billy Mercer, Jarred Pope, Kory Myers, Tanya Davis. Two critically-acclaimed albums have been released to date: *THE WAY LIFE GOES* (2013) and *RISE* (2019). The "LIVE LOUD 2024 TOUR", will have #keiferband hitting the tour trail this year with plenty of high energy, eardrum-shattering shows combining all the classic, chart topping hits of Cinderella with new faves from #keiferband releases.

Solo releases... "RISE" & "THE WAY LIFE GOES" Stats and review quotes

#keiferband's 2019 studio album "RISE", (Billboard Top 10 Hard Rock Sales), released September 13th, 2019 on Cleopatra Records features the rousing, rollicking rock singles, "The Death of Me" and "HYPE". Both singles landed in the Billboard Mainstream Rock Top 40 with "The Death of Me" sitting five weeks inside the top 20, peaking at #18 and "HYPE" spending four weeks inside the top 40, peaking at #32. Produced by Tom Keifer, Savannah Keifer, and Kyle O'Connor. Rise signifies the ongoing evolution of the former Cinderella frontman as a person, songwriter, and bandleader. Keifer's deep-seated roots shine through to the very core on "RISE", something that was embedded at the very heart of his music created during the multiplatinum Cinderella days

Keifer's first solo release, 2013's "THE WAY LIFE GOES" cracked Billboard's Mainstream Rock Top 40 with it's first single "SOLID GROUND", peaking at #14 and holding inside the top 15 for nearly two months. The second single, "THE FLOWER SONG", received multi-format airplay on Mainstream Rock, AAA and POP... Including 8 weeks of heavy rotation on SIRIUS/XM's "20 on 20". A deluxe edition of "THE WAY LIFE GOES", featuring bonus tracks, DVD documentary and special custom artwork was released in 2017. One of the featured bonus tracks was a duet of Cinderella's classic "NOBODY's FOOL" with Halestorm's Lzzy Hale. The collaboration on the classic song landed another top 40 single, peaking at #30 on Billboards Active Rock chart.

Though Keifer has faced many ups and downs all throughout his storied career, his unyielding resilience can be found well within the grooves of both solo releases, "THE WAY LIFE GOES" and "RISE". And, in this moment, it's fair to say "RISE", is the perfectly realized album that's brought #keiferband directly to the next summit.
